1. SQUARE IN A SQUARE (Stitch-and-Flip Corners)

- Place one small square on larger square, right sides facing and aligning raw edges.
- Draw a line diagonally on wrong sides.
- Move the needle once over from the line toward the outside that would be cut off.
- Sew on drawn line.
- Trim ¼" beyond stitching.
- Press open to reveal triangle.

2. TRIANGLE-SQUARES

- 1 light and 1 dark color fabric.
- Cut two squares 7/8" larger than desired finished size of triangle square.
- On wrong side of one square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. This is the cutting line.
- Draw sewing lines ¼" away from each side of the cutting line.
- Place marked square on top of other square, right sides facing. Sew along marked sewing lines.
- Cut along marked cutting line
- Press seam allowances toward darker fabric,
- Tip: This method works for any size triangle-square. Cut squares the finished size of the triangle-squares plus 7/8".

3. HOURGLASS UNIT

- From 1 light and 1 dark fabric, cut 1 square 1¼ " larger than the desired finished size of the hourglass unit. For example, to make an hourglass unit that will finish at 2 ½", cut 3 ¾" squares.
- On wrong side of light square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner across the square. Then draw sewing lines on each side of the line, ¼" away.
- Place light square atop dark square, right sides facing; stitch along marked sewing lines.
- Cut between rows of stitching to make two triangle-squares. Press seams toward darker fabric.
- On wrong side of one triangle-square, draw a line diagonally across square, perpendicular to seam, aligning center line with corners of square. Then draw sewing lines on each side of the first line, ¼" away.
- Place triangle-square with drawn line atop matching triangle-square, right sides and opposite fabrics facing. Stitch along both drawn lines. Cut between rows of stitching to create two hourglass units. Press seam to one side.

3. FLYING GEESE UNITS

- On wrong side of each small square, draw a line diagonally from corner to corner across the square. Then draw sewing lines on each side of the first line, ¼" away.
- Place 2 matching small squares atop 1 larger square, right sides facing. Corners will overlap slightly. Stitch along both marked sewing lines.
- Cut between rows of stitching. Press seams toward small triangles.
- Place 2 small squares atop the triangle units.
- Stitch on marked lines.
- Cut between rows of stitching.
- Press seams toward small triangles to complete 4 Flying Geese Units.

• Tip: To cut squares for Flying Geese Units, determine desired finished size. Cut small squares 7/8" larger than finished height of flying Geese Unit; cut large square 1 ¼" larger than finished width.
